

Fascist Said What?

Fascist Said What? is card-based fill-in-the-blank party game (like *Apples to Apples* or *Cards Against Humanity*) in which players judge which responses submitted by the other players is the best one.

Setup

1. Shuffle the Response cards and deal 7 to each player.
2. Shuffle the Prompt cards.
3. Pick which player will be the first Decider. (After that, the Decider role rotates clockwise among all the players, round by round.)

Each round of play

4. The Decider picks a Prompt card and reads it out loud.
5. Each of the other players submits the Response card from their hand that they think the Decider will like the most.
6. After all the Response cards have been submitted, the Decider shuffles them (so as not to know who submitted which card) and then reads the possible responses out loud.
 - Suggestion: Read the Prompt out loud before reading each Response.
7. The Decider picks the one they liked the most.
 - That player gets the Prompt card as a way of recording the point they won.
 - All the submitted Response cards are discarded.
 - All players can take more cards from the Response deck until they're back up to the maximum of 7 cards in their hand.
8. The Decider role rotates to the next player and we go back to step #4.

The game can continue until:

- A certain time limit.
- A certain number of rounds.
- One of the players achieves a certain score.
- Everyone gets too depressed to go on.

Optional House Rules

- Once per game, a player can submit two Responses rather than one.
- Create a third type of card: a Double Down card.
 - Each player gets one per game.
 - At any point, the player can submit their Double Down card along with their Response.
 - If they win that round, they get double points. (Add the Double Down card to their collection of won Prompt cards to represent the extra point they won.)
- On any turn, rather than submit a Response to a Prompt, a player can exchange as many of their Response cards as they like for new ones.
- At the end of the game, each player donates their number of points in dollars to some organization growing and getting out the Democratic vote. See my suggestions at:
